### FORMAT

---

#### PHYSICAL (practicing professionals)

- The (2) virtual/ electronic images as described in the Submittal Guidelines, mounted on (2) 24 x 36 boards and 1/2 " thick or less.  
Landscape format is preferred and optimal for future publication. Please keep in mind the WMIG publication is left-bound landscape format. Vertical boards will be published bottom to top, not side by side. When submitting boards please use the same orientation for both.
- Please consider how your print and presentation choices impact the power of your project board's message. Sustainable materials and finishes are encouraged.
- Label the back of each board with your assigned project number and firm name to ensure it is returned to you. Please indicate the order of boards for display (left and right).
- One color print of each board @ 11"x17" in .pdf format.

#### DIGITAL (students and emerging green builders)

- (2) virtual/electronic 36" x 24 "boards based on the image size requirements below to support your submission, such as photographs, drawings or renderings.
- Submit 1 PDF file and 1 image file of each board.
- Image file size: 1536 x 1024 or 1280 x 1024 in jpeg, tif, or bmp format
- Landscape format is preferred and optimal for future publication. Please keep in mind the WMIG publication is left-bound landscape format. Vertical boards will be published bottom to top, not side by side. When submitting boards please use the same orientation for both.
- One color print of each board @ 11"x17" in .pdf format. Images used to convert to a .pdf and the .pdf itself shall have a minimum resolution of 300dpi.
- Please use a clear file naming system and indicate order of images in file name (E.G. WMIG07\_FirmName\_ProjectNumber\_01\_left.pdf)
- Label disk (and jacket if used) with your assigned project number and firm/team name.
- Photo/Image Release: By submitting your project to the Living Future event you are authorizing AIA Seattle COTE and Cascadia Region Green Building Council the right to use your submittal in the WMIG2007 publication. Projects may be selected for further display at various sustainable design websites and forums. If your project is chosen for further display, you will be notified. If you do not want your project displayed after the event, you must notify AIA Seattle or Cascadia Region Green Building Council.

## PANEL/JURY DISCUSSION

---

- Between March 29 and April 25, the jury will meet to familiarize themselves with the projects, make their assessments, and pick award winners for each group.
- The projects will be used to begin a discussion on the merits of The Living Building Challenge during WMIG07 on April 26.
- The award winners will be announced at Cascadia's Living Building Challenge on April 27.
- This competition is designed to generate interest and educate fellow professionals on The Living Building Challenge from Cascadia Region Green Building Council. The more your project submittal meets the established criteria the easier it will be for the jury to award prizes and the panel to generate a discussion.
- Issues that will be used by the panel in analysis of project submittals:
  - Generate all of its own energy with renewable resources
  - Captures and treats all of its water on site
  - Uses resources efficiently, and for maximum beauty.
