TRANSFORMING HOW WE THINK OF EXISTING AND HERITAGE BUILDINGS: GREEN REHABILITATION AND SUSTAINABILITY FORUM

Background: With global climate change upon us, we are challenged to find a way of living that will ensure the longevity and health of our environmental, economic, and social resources. Since buildings are responsible for approximately 40% of carbon dioxide emissions each year, considerable focus has been placed on the construction of new green buildings. However, a study by the National Round table on the Environment and the Economy indicates that 66 per cent of buildings that will be standing in 2050 are already built. This means that there will be major renovation effort needed to bring these buildings up to the standards necessary to meet the aggressive goals set out by our provincial government and the CaGBC in order to affect climate change.

Forum / Workshop: Participants will attend a two-day forum / workshop where they will examine the current state of the province for heritage and green buildings and sustainable communities in British Columbia in an effort to contribute to the green building and heritage/existing building initiatives (e.g. LEED NC for New Construction and Major Renovation, LEED EBOM for Existing Buildings Operations and Maintenance, LEED CI for Commercial Interiors, the BC Green Building Code and the Standards and Guidelines for the Conservation of Historic Places in Canada).
